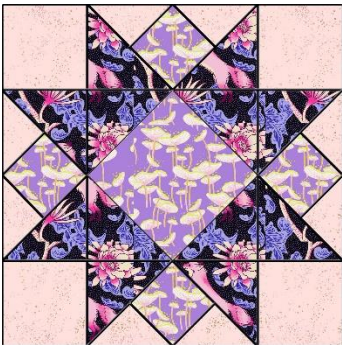

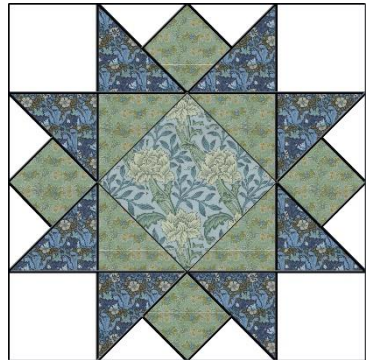
Monthly Kits: Each month members will get a kit for that month's block or Blocks that include the pattern, fabric, and newsletter about that month's chosen person of history. (Sometimes we throw recipes in too!)

Two Themes to Choose From:



Pacific Theater: Fabrics with a tropical vibe! Ruby Star, Batiks, Grunges, and anything else that looks good.

Western Front: Fabrics that pay homage to English Gardens, tea & Crumpets, and Agatha Christie novels! William Morris reproductions, Liberty Fabrics, French Generals, and anything else that looks good.

Quilt Project: At the end of the year, you will have enough blocks & fabric to make a quilt featuring twelve 18" (finished) blocks!

Optional Meetings Facts:

- Usually held the first consecutive Friday and Saturday of the Month.
- Friday, 10:30 am, Saturday 9:00 am or 10:30 am.
- scheduled for one hour (might take less time)
- discuss that month's subject, plus upcoming events.
- Show and tell (bring some! It helps make you eligible for prizes)
- *We usually have cookies. *

The meetings are not a class. We don't sew during them, and little to none quilt instruction is given, as this program is set up for those with basic piecing skills.

Rules/Quilt Club Policies Yes, there are rules.**Rules for Meetings:**

1. No whining about the rules.

2. Arrive on time to get a chance to enter that meeting drawing. (We move the jar when class starts, so you can't enter the drawing if you're late.)

2. Show and tell is restricted to quilts and quilt-like projects. Why? It helps people get excited about fabric...which sell!

3. Please don't announce other Quilt stores' upcoming sales or specials during the meeting. We want to make money in our store.

4. 3. All kits must be picked up and paid for before entering the classroom.

5. Silence your cell phone before the meeting. If you're in a position where you might need to take a call during class, sit near the door on the right side of the room so you don't annoy class members when you get up and leave.

8. Call and check to see if we have availability before you bring a guest.

Rules about the Program in General:

- 1.No skipping block kits. It's an all or none deal.
2. If you miss picking up and paying for your block more than two months in a row without communicating with us, you will be dropped from the roster and will be required to pay the registration fee (again) to continue.
3. Kits will be available to pick up the day of the scheduled meeting times. They are never available to pick up earlier than that.

Meeting Times:

First Consecutive Friday and Saturday of the Month.

Friday: 10:30. Am.

Saturdays: 9:00 am or 10:30 am

Note. The store is still technically closed at 9 am, so only half the lights will be on, and the open sign will not be lit.

Closure and Emergency Procedures.

Should we be forced to restrict class sizes due to a pandemic outbreak, more meetings will be added to the schedule, allowing fewer people per class. Let's cross our fingers and hope we don't have to pull this option out of the hat again.

In case of weather-related closures (snow, ice, whatever) or other emergencies, we allow members to pick up their kits and use their coupons for the shopping spree within a designated week. Details regarding this are e-mailed to members, so give us your good email address for this, instead of the junk mail one.

Weather related emergencies are relayed to members and customers via e-mail (when Possible) announced on our Facebook page, and occasionally we have had to call people. We base the decision to close for the weather on what's happening in our area. If there is ice at your house, we recommend coming to pick up your kit later vs. trying to come to class so you can get that coupon. Your life is worth more than potentially saving \$9.

Other emergencies will be relayed by e-mail, Facebook, and possibly a phone call.

Should any of the dates change for some reason (except for emergencies) you are sent a notification by e-mail, a physical note is given in your kit, and we probably bored you by talking about the reason during one of the previous meetings.

Commonly Asked Questions about Progressive Quilt Club

What is the difference between a class, or a regular Block of the Month, and this program?

This program is how we design future B.O.M programs, kits, classes, quilt challenges, etc. People who register are ...quilting ginny pigs! You're the ones who give us feedback on how to move the store forward in the future.

So, while we might have a quick demonstration of a technique occasionally, this is not like a class where you will be bringing your machine and working with an instructor.

Regular Block of the Month programs usually include sashing's, borders, and binding, and the cost will reflect that. Because this program is a mystery, and because you guys are helping us out with potential future projects, that is why this program is a flat \$15 instead of \$35. To thank you for being our ginny pigs, we reward you with cookies and discounted shopping sprees.

However, because you're getting the "first look" at future programs, we need to remind you we *will occasionally need grace*. Despite the fact we now have five people proofreading the instructions, typos slip in. We will e-mail out instructions, and if needed, provide you with the necessary fabric when it is our error.

We will also point out...we can't be held responsible for mistakes made on your end. But we will empathize. *Been there, done that.*

How does the Theme Work?

Each year we pick a theme and roll with it. We have designed quilts around farming, spies, mischievous and strong woman, literary and historic figures. Sometimes we have done pictorial quilts that went with the theme.

This year, we are just doing basic blocks we like and talking about awesome and entertaining people.

Will the Quilt be complete at the end? Or will we have to buy more fabric?

Totally up to you. If you don't add any sashing or borders, Twelve 18" blocks make a pretty decent lap quilt.

We do give you nifty discounts, however, so use some and make that sucker big enough for your bed if you want!
